Candidates should meet both Maine Certification and highly qualified requirements and enjoy working with non-traditional learners in a hands-on, project based, year-round learning environment. Demonstration of subject matter knowledge, backwards design and strong classroom management skills are necessary.

## **Responsibilities:**

- Develop curriculum integrated with our schools themes of agriculture, forestry and the environment.
- □ Direct instruction in Life Science Curriculum.
- □ Helping to develop and implement student presentations on their individual or group studies.
- Serve as Advisor for students.
- □ Participate in staff and team meetings.
- □ Work in a highly collaborative fashion with other content area teachers integrating Science into all aspects of our learning environment including Arts and Humanities.
- □ Develop, research, and use assessment tools that measure student academic growth in a method which is congruent with how they learn.
- □ Support students who are interested in increasing their scores on college related tests such as the SAT and the ACT.
- □ Share all duties with other staff such as lunch and elective supervision.
- □ Employ restorative practices to build community and address student behavior.
- □ Schedule and facilitate student led conferences for advisees.
- □ Create quarterly progress reports for advisees.
- □ Contact advisees' parents on a weekly basis updating them on student progress.
- ☐ Interest/enthusiasm for improving skills by attending professional development opportunities as appropriate.
- Reports all incidents of work related accident/illness within 24 hours; maintain a safe work environment; ensure that a safe environment is maintained in the workplace by adhering to all safety rules and requirements (Safety Policies) and report any safety hazards to immediate supervisor.
- Demonstrates awareness and sensitivity to the cultural and socioeconomic characteristics of the service population.
